

A Message from the Elders

Our church is currently observing the six-week liturgical season of Lent, which started on Ash Wednesday (26th February). To mark this solemn season, some decorations around the church are removed and a purple cloth is draped over the cross, symbolising penance and mourning.

Last week we examined the first of three traditional practices associated with Lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Throughout the Lenten season we conform to these practices with renewed vigour in pursuit of a closer relationship with our holy Father.

Many Christians use fasting, as well as giving up certain luxuries and leading a simpler life, as a practical way to take part in Lent and renew their relationship with God. Some fast by limiting the amount and type of meals eaten during Lent, whilst others give up luxuries such as chocolate, coffee, tea, alcohol and/or take-away food. For others Lenten fasting also includes limiting screen time, giving up or limiting the use of social media and not taking part in negative talk, sarcasm or criticism for the 40-day period.

The Bible contains many accounts of 40-day fasting. Read about Moses in Exodus 34: 28, Elijah in 1 Kings 19: 8 and Jesus in Matthew 4: 2. Let the words of Joel 2: 12-14 fill you with inspiration to take part in Lent.
