Don't Fence Me In!

"Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around vou and take vou where vou do not wish to go." (Jn 21:18)

As some social restrictions due to COVID-19 have relaxed a little, it's been fascinating to see people come out of the "lockdown woodwork" with a vengeance! This is a natural reaction to the forced confinement we've all tasted. It's also an expression of the truth that God made us in His very image, as noble overseers of His creation, to live in freedom.

While we are enjoying some freedoms, we are a long way from clear of all the restrictions, and who knows if we ever will be like we once were?!...

The Bible says that "God has bound all in disobedience, so that He may have mercy upon all" (Ro 11:32); i.e. there is a bondage that all of us are under and must come to terms with, but that in doing so we discover true freedom!

We rankle against restriction both because is runs counter to the freedom for which God created and redeemed us, and because it reminds us of the disobedience from which God alone must redeem us, which He does liberally in grace for all who look to Him in faith and repentance. In this way, the restrictions placed upon us can actually become the instruments that lead us to know greater freedom in Christ. That's why the Bible can even tell us to rejoice in our suffering! (Ro 51-5)

The Bible says that this freedom makes us completely new people, (2Cor 5:17), and gives us the gift of eternal life! (Jn 4:14). This is the kind of freedom that is bigger and stronger than any restriction or confinement, and can give us peace, hope and joy in the face of them.

A Message from the Elders

Today is the seventh and final Sunday in Eastertide. The liturgical season commenced on Easter Sunday with our Lord's Resurrection and concludes with the Ascension of Jesus, which happened on the 40th day (this past Thursday). However, many churches choose to commemorate the Ascension on this Sunday.

Prior to Jesus ascending to heaven from the Mount of Olives, He gave the disciples one last set of instructions (Matthew 28:16-20). In this passage He commands the disciples to make more disciples, out of all peoples, teaching and baptising them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. How are the disciples going to accomplish this massive task?

Read Acts 1:1-11. In this passage we see that the disciples are not to rely on their own efforts to spread the Good News of the Gospel, but to wait for the Holy Spirit, which will enable them and empower them for all their evangelistic and missionary efforts.

Jesus' ascension into heaven also confirms His divine status as the Son of God and fulfils His earlier promise to the disciples that He must go to His Father's house to prepare a place for all of us. In John 14:1-14, Jesus teaches that He is the only way to the Father, who is the source of eternal life. No-one can reach the Father, except through knowing Jesus. And, if we don't tell others about Jesus, how will they be saved?

Read John 14:15-31. In this passage Jesus promises that He will send another Advocate, who will teach us and remind us of all the things He said. This Advocate is the Holy Spirit, who came on the day of Pentecost and is the Encourager whom Jesus had told the disciples to wait for in Jerusalem.

It is not on our own strength that we are called by Jesus to be His disciples and to spread the Gospel. Just like the original disciples, we too need the Encourager to live in us, enabling, instructing and strengthening us to be His disciples for His glory.

<u>Packets</u>: muesli bars, breakfast cereals, cheese & cracker snacks, 2 minute noodles, pasta

UHT milk (lots), baby nappies, bread (usually from bakers or supermarkets), apples, lemons, seasonally available fruit, green vegetables, carrots, eggs.
