A Message from the Elders

Each one of us is fortunate to be free to choose our own actions and reactions, to our circumstances, in choosing the directions of our lives, in what we do and in what we put in our hearts and minds. Read Galatians 5:13-21.

Verse 13 warns us against using our freedom to follow our own desires. No matter how good our initial intentions might be, our sinful nature corrupts our desires to be, at its core, all about what we want, about what we desire for ourselves and about what matters only to us, motivated by our own self-love, self-importance and self-justification. Verse 19 lists the results of such a choice. Clearly this is not a good choice. Choosing our own selfish desire is choosing eternal death.

Additionally verse 13 offers an alternate and exceedingly superior choice - serving one another in love. Verse 16 tells us where this type of love comes from - it comes from the Holy Spirit. By allowing the Holy Spirit to guide our lives, our hearts will be changed to follow the will of God, instead of our sinful nature. Read Galatians 5:22-26.

The kind of fruit the Spirit grows in us will allow us to produce a life that is pleasing to God, and we will experience love that is greater than what the human heart could ever dream of producing by itself. Read John 15:1-17 as well.

In your prayer time this week, read the words of Psalm 19 as a prayer of confession to God. Acknowledge His greatness and ask Him to help you make the best choice of your life, by asking for the Holy Spirit to be the guide within your heart.
