A Message from the Elders

In Galatians 5:22-23, we read about the kinds of fruit the Holy Spirit produces in our lives. This week we'll discuss Faithfulness, coming from the Greek word "pistis".

We might wrongly think of biblical faith as taking a leap in the dark or hoping that something good might happen to us, based on our good behaviour or positive visualisation skills. We might also think of faith in the context of a faithful person, someone we might think of as reliable, diligent and trustworthy. We could also wrongly describe faith as something we obtain by simply belonging to a church or being associated with a Bible study group.

Biblical faith is quite different from what we first imagine; it is confident action in response to what God has made known. In Hebrews 11 we read of multiple examples of faith into action, as portrayed by many faith-filled heroes over the ages, occurring in a variety of circumstances and resulting in a mixture of outcomes. This passage also shows us that faith is rewarded in God's own perfect time.

Deuteronomy 7:6-10 says that God has chosen us to be His special treasure (verse 6) and that He is a faithful God who keeps His promises of love for a thousand generations of those who love and keep His commandments (verse 9). Verse 10 warns that He does not hesitate to punish and destroy those who reject Him.

Hebrews 12:1-4 contains our response to the examples of faith we've read about in Hebrews 11. We must keep our eyes on Jesus, the originator and perfector of our faith!


