#### 31st October

In the Protestant Reformation of 1517, the Christian church, under the leadership of Martin Luther, rediscovered the truth that grace is the pulsing heart of Christian life. However, the 16th century had seen a loss of it within the church to an astonishing and deplorable extent.

It may be that the Christian church has again fallen in our time (including the Protestant churches and the Uniting Church) into a similar deplorable state in a *loss of the truth of grace*, marked by:

Rejecting the truth of the God of grace - Creator and Redeemer of the world - in His Holy Scriptures

Rejecting the truth of His grace in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ as the only thing in time or eternity that can save us and give us fullness of life

### **An Update on Oxford & Others**

Because of COVID restrictions preventing our Guide Dog trainer from re-entering South Australia, Oxford was flown to Melbourne to begin his training with her there. He travelled well and had a few days of training until, after three weeks, he was flown back home to Adelaide – the trainer finally being permitted to re-enter South Australia, recognised as an essential worker. She still had to quarantine in a hotel in Adelaide for two weeks. Meanwhile Oxford was boarded with his original puppy raiser in Norwood. He would have come back to us but we had Raven (the small black female) with us by then. Oxford will recommence his career in seven days' time.

Raven has her assessment on 13 November. This is a final test to see if she is capable of continuing in the Guide Dog programme. She lives at Aldinga Beach.

Wistow also lives at Aldinga Beach with Raven but is with us just now to let her puppy raiser concentrate on developing Raven. We shall have Wistow with us for a few more weeks. She is a 'work in progress'. Yeah, definitely a 'work in progress'.

Chevy, whom we had on two occasions, finally graduated to become an assistance dog to a young man in a wheelchair, picking up items for him, pressing pedestrian crossing buttons, lift buttons and even turning lights on and off for him.

Apollo, a black male whom we had a two years ago, graduated to work as a Facility Dog to Kidman Park Primary School. His role involves assisting students with emotional development, physical wellbeing and social development. Who would have thought that a dog could have such an impact?

We thank you for your patience and understanding as we help to train these dogs to become val-

uable members of our etv. Please continue to resist the enormous temptation to pat

or talk to them.
