I hope you also have experienced the joy of reading something in the Bible and knowing that God is speaking through a passage directly to your heart, addressing your life as it is at that time. God certainly did that for me as we worked our way through the second chapter. From verse 11, it reads -

Here is a trustworthy saying:

If we died with him, we will also live with him; If we endure, we will also reign with him. If we disown him, he will also disown us: If we are faithless, he remains faithful, for he cannot disown himself.

Surely, these words express the heart of the Gospel and highlight God's utter faithfulness? The next couple of verses impacted on me with such force that they have become my constant prayer ever since—

Keep reminding God's people of these things. Warn them before God against quarrelling about words; it is of no value, and only ruins those who listen. Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who does not need to be ashamed [of the Gospel] and who correctly handles the word of truth.

Given the training I had just embarked upon and the goal of that training, I felt God encouraging me in my endeavours and setting out what was to be the core of my life preaching. It could be a special word to your heart as well.

It has been suggested that I reprint this for the benefit of those who have joined our church family recently, and those who may wish to refresh their memory.

Philippines Child Education Sponsorship

Golden Grove U.C.A. continues to support our sister church in Davao City in the Philippines in their Hope Ministry, as it seeks to help poor families afford the extra costs of their children's education.

Although education is free, mandatory and State funded, the cost of education supplies, text books, uniforms, travel to secondary schools, etc., is beyond the reach of very many poor families and orphaned children.

Our sponsorship scheme, initiated by the late Rev. Robert Iles, began in 2006, and we currently support 27 children. As a result of our assistance over the years, a number have graduated from High School and even from University, while many more have found employment, and other children have taken their places in the scheme.

Our sponsors contribute \$90 per quarter, in March, June, September and December. This equates to about \$1 per day; a very small sum to us, but it buys a great deal more in the Philippines. This amount was established in 2006. Hence, some of our sponsors regard this as a minimum only, but this is an individual decision. and a further two are supported by the 'Philippines jars''.





At present (February, 2021) 16 of our church families are involved in the sponsorship scheme, together with 6 people/ families who don't currently worship in our church. In addition, 1 child is sponsored by the Mission and Wider Work Committee and a further 2 are supported by the 'Philippines jars".

Currently, a total of 27 children have a more hopeful future as a result of this scheme: a very laudable effort!

If you wish to know more about the scheme, please speak to me at any time; Luciano always has more children in his ministry who would welcome the opportunities that our sponsorship brings.
