### **Up Close and Personal**

Psalm 19:1,4,8,11

"The heavens declare the glory of God;.... Their voice goes out into all the earth,...."
"The commands of the Lord are radiant, giving light to the eyes.... By them your servant is warned: in keeping them there is great reward."

Every part of creation speaks of the glory of God. Like a work of art, the creation cannot help but point to the artist - the Creator. Yet it is possible for us to acknowledge the truth that God is behind the created world, but still *not have anything to do with Him personally*. We can think, "that's great that God has made this amazing creation, as long as He doesn't 'mess' with my life too much, nor expect me to get too involved with Him!

As Christians we can do that!...

But this is never enough, because salvation and fullness of life are *in God*, and so only become ours *by having a real, personal relationship with God* (Ps 3:8); only by Him being "up close and personal" with us, and we with Him.

For that to happen we need more than just the truth of God's presence and work reflected in the creation. For that we need the clear, penetrating *Word of God* (the whole truth of God taught in the Bible) to speak to us, and into our lives. Only this truly shows us our sins, declares the forgiving grace of God, and gives and leads us in a new life as God's dear children.

Then God's Word isn't just speaking in the distant heavens, it's speaking in our "bowels" - i.e., the deep-

So, *let's get into our Bibles!...* everyone of us, every day, soak in God's Word. It's the only way to be truly, fully alive as human beings. (\*and if we need help with how to go about that, speak to the Minister of one of the Elders)

### A Message from the Elders

The Lenten season is the perfect time to take a good, hard, inward look at ourselves. It's an opportunity, not for personal improvement or character development in the everyday sense, but rather an opportunity for spiritual cleansing and a time to realign our purposes with God's purposes.

In John 2:13-22 we read how Jesus went to the temple in Jerusalem during the preparations for the Jewish Passover festival and found the temple to be filled with merchants selling animals and exchanging foreign currency. The house of God, an institution of worship, prayer, sacrifice and instruction, had been reduced to a common marketplace.

Our hearts can be like this temple. If we are not careful, we can allow a place reserved for the Holy Spirit to become a place filled with all kinds of everyday, ordinary things. We think that we shall end up filling ourselves with what seems practical and logical, but in fact we end up filling ourselves with what satisfies us here and now - on demand, just the way we want it. Does this ever last? Do these things actually end up bringing joy to our lives?

In verse 15 we read how Jesus cleansed the temple by driving out the merchants, and so too we must continually examine ourselves; and ask our Lord Jesus to step into our lives in order to drive out the things that have taken His place in our hearts.

Whom do you worship in your temple? Take care of your heart.
