Then, what had seemed above our heads and unreal is all of a sudden coursing through our veins, inside our bones, affecting how we think, what we say, and how we live our lives.

All we have to do is pray, trust Him, and stop resisting Him; He will do all the rest.

A Message from the Elders

The liturgical season of Easter spans fifty days and included eight Sundays, of which today is the final Sunday. Throughout this season we focussed on the Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus Christ; and on this final Sunday we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Jesus' disciples on the Day of Pentecost.

Prior to Jesus' Ascension to Heaven, He instructed the disciples to wait in Jerusalem to receive empowerment from the Holy Spirit for the task of spreading the Gospel (Acts 1:4-9); and, in Acts 2:1-14, we read that the Spirit did indeed come upon them, just as Jesus had promised.

The disciples were empowered with special gifts (verse 4). They spread the Gospel by telling people of the wonders of God (verses 5-12), the Resurrection of Jesus Christ (verses 31-33) and about the forgiveness of sins (verses 38-41). Upon hearing the Gospel message, the people responded and many accepted the message, became believers and were baptised (verse 41). These people received new life.

It is the mission of the church to spread the Gospel, and, as disciples of the Lord Jesus, we share in this task. God does not leave it up to us to do it all by ourselves. Like the original disciples, we too need empowerment from the Holy Spirit to enable and equip us for the purpose that God has in mind for us. Seek the Holy Spirit and let Him make His home in your heart. Trust Him to guide you into all the truth (John 16:13).
