A Message from the Elders

Being of good health is a blessing from God. It is a blessing we take for granted and it is only when our own health, or the health of someone close to us is threatened, that we realise how great a blessing being healthy truly is.

Mark 5:24-34 details an account of a woman who suffered constant ill health over a period of many years. Her condition not only brought poor health, but also made her ceremonially unclean and unable to take part in regular worship activities within the community, according to the laws and customs of that time (see Leviticus 15:25-27).

As any sensible person would, she sought medical treatment for her condition, which unfortunately cost her everything she had, and, in the end, as Mark 5:26 tells us, her health deteriorated and her desperation grew. She had nowhere else to turn but Jesus - a person she had only heard about (verse 27).

She did not know Jesus personally, but believed that, if she could only touch His cloak, then she would be healed of her affliction. She believed that a miracle would happen for her, and it did, as we read in verses 28-34.

There are two take-aways for us from this passage: firstly, this woman would have had nowhere else to turn had she not heard of Jesus, and, secondly, her faith in Jesus's ability to heal her miraculously is an example of true faith for us to follow. An example of implicit and ultimate trust in the almighty and one true God.

Tell others of Jesus. Help them to find His miracle for their life.
