## **Holy Insecurity**

In South Australia, we're feeling as if we've 'dodged a bullet' to some extent, as far as COVID-19 infections and fatalities are concerned. Numbers of us have received at least one jab of a vaccine, and we hear of the daily numbers of vaccinations rapidly climbing. Yet, for all that, vaccine hesitancy is still widespread, and the danger of a virulent outbreak hasn't disappeared. There's still an awful lot of uncertainty and insecurity in the community.

When will we be free of worry and feel secure? The truth is, we don't know; and, even when COVID-19 is 'under control', it is hard to see that things will ever go back to how they were before 2020. Another truth is, even when COVID-19 is not our number one concern, we will soon replace it with another that is likely to worry us just as much. "Man was born to suffering as the sparks fly upward", one of my favourite Bible verses says! (Job 5:7; my wife calls me "Eeyore"!... can't think why??....)

The Bible says that everything that can be shaken will be shaken (Heb 12:26-28). This is so that we will look for and find what is truly *unshakable* - eternally secure. i.e., God's truth, grace, salvation, and His new heaven and earth yet to be revealed. Therefore, our insecurity is not just a passing 'bad patch', but a good gift; not that we should be crushed or destroyed by it, but that, in the midst of it, we look to Jesus Christ in faith - our Redeemer, Saviour and Good Shepherd, and in Him know our security that overcomes all insecurity.

# **A Message from the Elders**

What an interesting time at worship last Sunday morning, being in a worship frame of mind, but required to remain totally silent and forced to simply listen and only think about what we hear, rather than actively taking part and singing our hearts out - a tough ask - especially during a song like Amazing Grace!

Our daily faith-walk with the Lord can be like this sometimes; we just hear the Gospel of Truth each Sunday - we only hear that we are saved by Grace through the blood of Jesus Christ. (Ephesians 1:7-10) We only hear that we stand forgiven and have been adopted into God's own family, exactly as He had planned since before time (verses 3-6). We only hear that He has given us the Holy Spirit, which identifies us as His own and guarantees that He has ransomed us (verses 11-14). All these things we only hear and think about, rather than actively take part in by living out our faith every day of the week.

The key difference here is that, unlike our worship last Sunday, where COVID restrictions prevented us from actively taking part in worship, in this case we are choosing not to take part; and our daily actions will be in conflict with the faith we think we have.

Indeed it is Amazing Grace that saves us, but only if we accept it, totally take it in by submitting and letting God mould us into whom He wants us to be. Only then will we be able to actively take part in His good plans for us and for all of creation. Only then will our daily faith-walk produce lasting good works that are a blessing to those around us. (James 2:14-26)
