This Sporting Life

It's been race, after race, after race on our TV screens this week, as the track and field week of the Olympic Games has been in full flight. If anything was going to ease the pain of COVID-19 for the sporting nation of Australia, it would be this mega-international festival of physicality!

Paul in the Bible says that the Christian life is a race: "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race,..." (2Tim 4:7). That also appeals to us as 'little Aussie battlers' - "we'll put our heads down, fight our hardest, and we're bound to get somewhere in the end"!

However, Paul defines the exact nature of that "fight" and "race" in the rest of that verse - i.e., "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." It is a "fight" and "race" of faith; we win them not out of our own strength or effort, but by trusting in and relying upon Jesus Christ's strength and effort.

The greatest fight we have is fighting to stop trusting in ourselves, and fighting to keep trusting in Christ alone!

If we find ourselves 'fighting' and 'racing' against the pandemic at the moment - or against any other crisis - in that too Christ is the only One we can trust to lift us up by the power of the Holy Spirit, keep us and carry us through to a place of safety. He will do this! I ean on Him!

A Message from the Elders

In John 6:22-71 Jesus explains to the crowd that He is the bread of life and that whomever eats this true bread from heaven will have eternal life (verse 51). Many people in the crowd had great difficulty in accepting this message, for they only knew Jesus as a man, as the son of Joseph; and did not fully understand that He was the Son of God (verses 41-43), who would soon give His life on the cross for their (and our) salvation.

The crowd was perplexed and argued with each other about what Jesus meant (verse 52). They were looking for a miracle: physical bread from heaven (verses 30-33) through the works of a prophet, like in the time of Moses when bread from heaven was given to the Israelites by God to sustain them. Misguided about who Jesus was, they wanted this miracle in exchange for belief do we not do this sometimes, asking God for a miracle or proof before we will believe?

Jesus continues to guide us towards the truth (verses 53-59). He explains that a person comes to seek God because God calls that person to search for Him (verses 37-40). Therefore we don't naturally do the seeking out of our own will, but rather through the will of God and through the work of the Holy Spirit within us (verse 63).

Imagine being there that day in the crowd. Imagine Jesus turning to you and asking if you believe and if you will follow Him. Will your reply be like Simon Peter's in verses 68-69, or will you desert Him, as many did, because His message just doesn't logically sound plausible?
