

God bless you! We say it under all sorts of circumstances and conditions. We seldom say it mechanically and formally, as other commonplace and oft-repeated expressions, but fervently, wholeheartedly and with a real depth of feeling.

For the celebrant, there comes that poignant moment when, the ceremony over, the register signed and all the formalities completed that the couple are ready to greet their family and friends. Only one thing seems to come naturally – **God bless you!**

There comes the final moment when, the funeral over, and the farewells made, that it is time to leave the sad and broken spirit. What can be helpfully shared in that last final act of parting? Again, only one thing seems to come naturally – **God bless you –** as you hold and shake the mourner's hand.

God gave Moses this blessing for the Israelites: *The LORD bless you and keep you: the LORD make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you: the LORD turn his face toward you and give you peace* (Numbers 6:24). **God bless you** is a blessing assuring God's people that he will bless them and keep them; showing them his shining face and his overflowing grace; revealing himself in beauty and majesty; and pouring into their troubled hearts the peace that passes all understanding. Wow! What a blessing!

A Message from the Elders

When we hear the word "armour", we might think of soldiers wearing defensive attire to protect their bodies in the heat of battle. Special protective clothing, reinforced in the right places, to protect the wearer from injuries that would otherwise have proven fatal. Armour, then, is meant to withstand attack and to provide a reliable measure of defence.

This type of physical protection has been around as long as conflict has been a part of our human existence; and, over the ages, it has been adapted to purpose and made out of a variety of materials to protect both the upper body and the head of the person wearing it. A good example being a mediaeval suit of full plate armour, offering protection to the entire body.

But what if the attack is coming from something other than flesh and blood enemies (Ephesians 6:12)? How can a metal suit of full plate armour protect me from the onslaught of the evil one? The answer is simple: it can't and it won't.

There is but one true suit of armour that would be the only reliable measure of effective defence in this case; and that is "The Armour of God". Read Ephesians 6:10-20.
