A Message from the Elders

To be able to stand firm against the strategies of the evil one, we must put on the whole Armour of God (Ephesians 6:10-20). In total there are six pieces that every Christian needs for protection and this week we put on the Breastplate of Righteousness (verse 14).

The function of a breastplate is to protect the vital organs of the upper body, defending the heart - the innermost part of our being. Righteousness means to be justified before God, to do what is right in the eyes of the Lord (Deuteronomy 6:18); and being judged according to His perfect standards for character, conscience, conduct and word - all the time!

Isaiah 59:17 says that the Lord Himself puts on Righteousness as His breastplate. God can do so, because He is perfect justice, truth and love. He is almighty, holy and without sin. We can't do this by ourselves, because we are unjust, we lie, we hate and we have been born into sin. (See Romans 3:9-26).

By believing in Jesus Christ and by repenting of our sins, we can be justified before God, as then it is Christ who stands in our place of judgement. By the transforming work of the Holy Spirit within us, we gain the strength to turn away from our sins, and gain the ability to put on Christ's Righteousness as breastplate to guard our hearts.
