Submitting

One Sunday a mum and dad were at church with their children. Their young boy insisted on standing on the chairs. He was placed off the chairs several times and chastised by his dad. After guite a 'wrestle', finally he sat, dutifully. His father said that he was a good boy for sitting quietly. He gritted his teeth and said, "I'm standing on the inside!"

All human beings are born with a proud spirit by nature. There is nothing that we find harder than submitting to authorities. The Bible tells us that all authorities that we have to deal with in life - whether parents, government, or any others, are put in place by God. He works through them for the good of the world and humanity (Ro 13:1-7).

Therefore, we are to submit to those authorities as a part of our submitting to God and His good will, and rebelling against those authorities is rebelling against God. The only exception might be when those authorities clearly oppose the word and will of God.

And this affects how we relate to everyone. Paul says, "submit to one another out of reverence for Christ" (Eph 5:21). Do we constantly complain, and 'wrestle' with one another in order to get our own way, or do we humbly listen to one another, and put others' wishes before our own? This is all a reflection of our submission to God and Christ.

Of course, the key for us to be able to do this is *the Gospel*. The saving grace of Jesus Christ is only given to the truly humble - those who submit themselves to God and others, which exalts and blesses us more than we can imagine (James 4:10)!

A Message from the Elders

To be able to remain standing firm after the onslaughts of the battle against the evil rulers and authorities of the unseen world, we must put on the whole Armour of God (Ephesians 6:10-20). In total there are six pieces that every Christian needs for protection, and this week we equip the Sword of the Spirit (verse 17).

A soldier's sword is not only an offensive weapon by which he or she can overcome adversaries, but it is also an effective defensive weapon through which the enemy's blows can be parried and deflected. However, to be able to use a sword proficiently requires not only a sharp sword, but perhaps more importantly; discipline, commitment and regular practice to hone one's skills.

A Christian's Sword of the Spirit is the Word of God (Ephesians 6:17) which is the sharpest of all two-edged swords, able to cut between soul and spirit (Hebrews 4:12). Just as a soldier needs to become proficient in wielding the sword, so too every Christian requires knowledge of the Word of God to become proficient in using the Sword of the Spirit in defence against adversity. Regularly reading our Bibles is a good way to hone our sword swinging skills.

Learn from our Master, Jesus Christ. During this week read Matthew 4:1-11. Read how Jesus was able to stand firm against the onslaughts of the devil in the desert. Are you currently walking through a desert? Now is the time to pick up your Sword of the Spirit.
