

## A Message from the Elders

Reflecting on the past few weeks regarding our discussion on the six pieces of the Armour of God (Ephesians 6:10-20), we looked at what each piece of His armour does and how it enables us to stand firm against the assaults of the evil one. We also discussed the necessity to equip all six pieces for complete protection: Belt of Truth, Breastplate of Righteousness, Shoes of the Gospel, Shield of Faith, Helmet of Salvation and Sword of the Spirit.

Ephesians 6:18-19 stresses the importance of bathing the whole set of armour in prayer. Specifically prayer "in the Spirit" that arises from the Spirit of God within us. Prayer not simply for our own daily needs resulting from external factors affecting our own lives, but persistent prayer for everyone in our community, flowing forth from the love for our neighbours, awakened by the Spirit of God dwelling inside of us.

Make prayer a part of your everyday life. As regular as a cup of coffee or tea, for it is prayer that brings us into communion and fellowship with God so that His armour can protect us. This week read and pray about these passages:

Philippians 4: 6-7,

Romans 8: 26-27,

1 Thessalonians 5: 16-24

and Jude 1: 20-21.
