## A Message from the Elders

The theme of Bible readings and teachings during the season of Advent is balanced between the remembrance of Christ's first coming and the anticipation of His triumphant return as Judge and Ruler at the end of time. ## Samaritan's Purse Shoeboxes

Once again our church family has demonstrated its boundless generosity in its wonderful contribution to the happiness of deprived children across the world. Thank you so very, very much.

In November the Adelaide centre for Samaritan's Purse processed 19,471 SA/NT boxes and 25,707 Victorian boxes - a grand total of 45,178 boxes! This was achieved over 20 days, with very good teams of volunteers, which included a number of worshippers from GGUC . This is a record for SA and we have been highly commended by the national leadership team. Please share this news with your groups. Every box represents a child who will be thrilled to receive a gift - very often the first and possibly the only one ever - and will hear that they are special and Jesus loves them.

We still don't know when our boxes will go - shipping arrangements are difficult to arrange in the current global environment - but I will let you know as soon as the containers arrive for us to pack in the cartons of boxes (480 large cartons containing approximately 10,500 boxes fill each 40 foot container).
