(Reverend Gordon)

When Billy Graham was asked why we should be poor in spirit, and shouldn't we strive to be rich in spirit? Graham brilliantly responded with the following:

We must be humble in our spirits. If you put the word "humble" in place of the word "poor," you will understand what He meant.

In other words, God welcomes those who come to Him, realising their own sin, spiritual emptiness, and poverty. We must not be self-satisfied or proud in our hearts, thinking we don't really need God. If we are, God cannot bless us.

The Bible says, "For the kind of sorrow God wants us to experience leads us away from sin and results in salvation. There's no regret for that kind of sorrow. But worldly sorrow, which lacks repentance, results in spiritual death."
