## **Serious Joy**

Lent, the name of the 40 day season prior to Easter, derives from the Old English word, *lencten*, meaning "Springtime" (northern hemisphere), and before that from the Germanic *longitinaz*, meaning "lengthening of days". It anticipates Easter, following upon Good Friday, and the victory of the light and life of Christ over the darkness of sin and death.

Within Christian truth, the realities behind Good Friday and Easter Day are never apart, but only and always fused inseparably together. We cannot know the greatness of the victory of Christ for the world, nor its unspeakable joy, revealed at Easter, without at once knowing the shocking depth and breadth of evil and of our sin, laid bare in the Crucifixion of Christ, from which He has saved us.

The truth of the fusion of Easter and Good Friday means that the joyful message of the Christian Gospel is never just religious, wishful thinking. It fully acknowledges the worst that the world can throw at us - the worst of evil and sin, and is victorious *through and over it!* This produces, as CS Lewis said, "the kind of happiness and wonder that makes you serious".

I pray for you to have a seriously joyful Lenten season.

## The Second Sunday in Lent

The Lenten season is the perfect time to take a good, hard, inward look at ourselves. It's an opportunity, not for personal improvement or character development in the everyday sense, but rather an opportunity for spiritual cleansing and a time to realign our purposes with God's purposes.

In John 2:13-22 we read how Jesus went to the temple in Jerusalem during the preparations for the Jewish Passover festival and found the temple to be filled with merchants selling animals and exchanging foreign currency. The house of God, an institution of worship, prayer, sacrifice and instruction, had been reduced to a common marketplace.

Our hearts can be like this temple. If we are not careful, we can allow a place reserved for the Holy Spirit to become a place filled with all kinds of everyday, ordinary things. We think that we shall end up filling ourselves with what seems practical and logical, but in fact we end up filling ourselves with what satisfies us here and now - on demand, just the way we want it. Does this ever last? Do these things actually end up bringing joy to our lives?

In verse 15 we read how Jesus cleansed the temple by driving out the merchants, and so too we must continually examine ourselves; and ask our Lord Jesus to step into our lives in order to drive out the things that have taken His place in our hearts.

Whom do you worship in your temple? Take care of your heart.

# **George Herbert**

The extract opposite is taken from a poem (Ash Wednesday: Lent) by the Reverend George Herbert. He was not only one of the notable metaphysical poets, but was also a skilled lutenist, a public orator and an ordained priest in the Church of England. He lived from 1593 to 1633, dying of consumption at the early age of only 39. At least two of his beautiful hymns are in "Together in Song". They are "Let all the world in every corner sing" (108) and "King of glory, King of peace" (201).
