### **EASTER EVERY DAY**

...if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith. (1 Corinthians 15.14).

There were the usual protests this year that the moment Christmas was over; the supermarkets had hot cross buns for sale. Whilst obviously their appearance is for commercial gain, they are a great daily reminder that the Easter event is the central fact of our Christian faith.

1 Corinthians 15 is arguably the New Testament's longest and most detailed treatise on Christ's resurrection.

Paul argues: If Jesus has been raised from the dead that proves he really was the Messiah. His death then was not a tragic and ghastly end, but God's strange means of dealing with the sin of the world. But, if he wasn't raised from the dead, he wasn't and isn't the Messiah, and his cross had no such effect. Sin has not been dealt with: the world is still as it was.

With Christ's resurrection, a new world has opened up, promising a life vet greater. more beautiful, more powerful, than this one. Without the hope of the resurrection, what is the point of being a Christian?

The bun with a cross on it is a great reminder of Christ's death and resurrection. That, and nothing less, is the Christian hope.

## **The Donkey: A Palm Sunday Poem**

When fishes flew and forests walked And figs grew upon thorn, Some moment when the moon was blood Then surely I was born.



With monstrous head and sickening cry
And ears like errant wings,
The devil's walking parody
On all four-footed things.

The tattered outlaw of the earth,
Of ancient crooked will;
Starve, scourge, deride me: I am dumb,
I keep my secret still.

Fools! For I also had my hour; One far fierce hour and sweet: There was a shout about my ears, And palms before my feet.

The above poem was written by Gilbert Keith Chesterton, who was born in 1874 and died in 1936. He was an English writer, a philosopher and a lay theologian. He was also a literary and art critic. He is probably remembered best today as the author of numerous and delightful short stories about Father Brown, a part-time Catholic priest and a part-time amateur detective. These stories were written in the decade prior to World War One. Any resemblance between them and the popular television series is purely coincidental. The above poem ennobles the humble donkey, a traditional symbol of peace, as he carries the quintessential symbol of heavenly peace, to His earth-shattering and life-changing destination, Jerusalem.
