Peter (John 21:1-19)

Almost right on the heels of Thomas, we have the story of Peter.

Some scholars believe that the book of John originally ended with 20:30-31. If the gospel had ended there, Peter could have breathed a sigh of relief, dodging the bullet of having to face the One he had betrayed and look Him in the eye.

After His resurrection, Jesus appears to seven disciples on the shores of the Sea of Tiberias and serves them breakfast. When Jesus is finished grilling the fish and bread, it's time for Him to grill Peter. Jesus questions Peter three times about his loyalty – "do you love me?" Peter felt hurt because Jesus asked the question three times, yet he had earlier denied his Lord three times, referring to the night of the trial of Jesus, when Peter was confronted as to whether he knew Jesus, he vociferously denied it three times (John 18:12-25). "Do you love me?" and, if so, "Feed my lambs."

Peter also is subjected to a grim vision of his own future, of a time when he, like Jesus, will be led where he doesn't want to go and will die a martyr's death (Jn 21:18).

Jesus stands on the shores of our lives. He stands at our front doors. And when we answer his knock, He has just two questions for us: "Do you love me?" and, if so, "What are you going to do about it?"

Samaritan's Purse and Christmas Boxes

Dear friends, with a lot of not-so-good news around these days, it is pleasing for me to have some great and encouraging news to share with you.

Firstly, 600,000 Operation Christmas Child shoe boxes arrived in Ukraine and were already being distributed as war began there. It has been very encouraging for Ukrainian Christian brothers and sisters to have special gifts to give children as they share the love of Jesus. Let us keep these folk in our prayers.

As you may be aware, Operation Christmas Child operates as a project of Samaritan's Purse and is internationally evangelistic. The rest of the projects are aid oriented - always motivated by the love of Jesus to care for struggling people and working in His name particularly in disaster areas. Recently they deployed teams to Goonda in NSW to help in the clean up after massive flooding there.

Secondly, Samaritan's Purse was very quick to despatch various aid to Ukraine. By mid-March a Samaritan's Purse aeroplane had arrived 5 times, with loads of goods and medical supplies, at Ukraine, near the Polish border, where refugees were arriving in large numbers with usually no belongings. Often they were elderly, very young (even newborn), sick, injured and in shock. Supplies were set up in basement spaces, where vans came to be filled with basic items to help relieve need and anxiety. An emergency hospital, also in a bunkered basement, staffed with volunteers, met immediate health needs from bandages and medication to operations. We may not all be able to go in person, but we can pray for the safety and strength of those volunteering there in Jesus's name. These stories are very much worth hearing. In an internet search I found other interesting videos, particularly one with a Samaritan's Purse aeroplane being prepared to leave for Ukraine. I encourage you to check out these clips and encourage your church groups to see them also. May God richly bless you as you serve Him in many and various ways, including encouraging people in your churches and groups to pack shoe boxes. In May I hope to have news about resources for OCC.
