From one blood [God] made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, so that they would search for God... and find him. [Acts 17:26,27]

Paul could have been speaking of us in twenty-first century Australia! We are indeed made up of all the nations of the earth – e.g., hundreds of Aboriginal nations, African nations, Asian nations, Arab nations, European nations, and the British.

The "one blood" from which God made all the nations refers to our common ancestor, Adam. It also refers to the blood of Jesus Christ – a "Second Adam" (1Cor 15:45) - through whom God reconciled us to Himself (Col 1:20,21), and to one another (Eph 2:16-19), remaking us as "one new humanity" (Eph 2:15), no longer strangers to one another, but belonging to the one household of God.

In Australia we have known the pain of separation and conflict, and tasted the peace and joy of true reconciliation and community. There are "worlds" more yet for us to discover of the riches of true community. Trusting in Christ who has reconciled us, hold out that reconciliation to all people in greatest hope (2 Cor 5:18-21)!

The Deaths of the Reverend Ian Moulton and His Wife

It is with great sadness that we acknowledge the passing of the Reverend Ian Moulton, who died in his sleep at 8.00 am on Saturday, 7th January. He was ninety-nine years old, just six months shy of his centenary. Ian was a faithful servant of our Lord for his entire life. He was a passionate preacher whose sermons could sometimes make the pulpit tremble. His fellowship groups were much enlivened by his wicked sense of humour and his inexhaustible knowledge of his beloved Bible. Like Jonathan, he was both a keen fisherman and a fisher of men. Ian's funeral was conducted by Pastor Kynan Brookes on Tuesday, 17th January in the Hope Valley Uniting Church.

It saddens us once again to announce that Ian's dearly beloved wife, Shirley, passed away at 10.30 pm on Wednesday, 18th January, in her ninetieth year. She was a treasured member of our church, who was loved by all who knew her and a true disciple of her Lord. Ian and she were married by the Reverend Brian Ball in our church on 11th June, 1983.

It is important that these views are respected and that collectively we have constructive conversations about this history and seek ways to move forward together as a nation.

Our national day provides an opportunity to acknowledge and learn about our nation's past. It is a time to reflect on and learn about our national journey, including the ongoing history, traditions and cultures of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.
