Awakening

The language of awakening has a great place within the traditions that formed the Uniting Church. It has been used to describe times of significant revival in the spiritual life and mission of the Church. Awakening is also about individual believers becoming fully aware of the truth and power of Jesus Christ and being transformed by it.

But no one wakes themselves. You have to be stirred awake by something or someone other than yourself - e.g., the dawning day, the blessed alarm clock, or a perhaps not altogether friendly mum or dad or spouse! The same is true spiritually. That's why Paul says, "once you were darkness, but now in the Lord you are light" (Eph 4:8). Before we could wake up, a great light needed to dawn in order to stir us.

This means that we don't become fully awake as Christians by trying harder to become fully awake! If we thought we could awaken ourselves, I'm afraid "we'd be dreamin"! No, we only become fully awake as Christians by coming back, again and again and again – every day - to gaze upon the light - Jesus Christ (Jn 8:12).

Gazing upon Jesus and His truth – which we have in the whole teaching of the Bible - will warm and stir us to be fully awake, fully alive - on fire! – for Jesus and what He loves. Then we will "live as children of the light" (Eph 5:8).

MAUNDY MONEY

Gifts in money were given by the sovereign on Maundy Thursday to the number of poor aged men and women that corresponded with his or her age. Broadcloth, fish, bread and wine were given in the reign of Elizabeth I, later, clothing and provisions. The clothing was replaced by money in 1725 as were the provisions in 1837. In due course the ceremony was transferred from the chapel at Whitehall to Westminster Abbey. Personal distribution of the doles ceased in 1688, until George V restarted it in 1932, as did Edward VIII in 1936. Queen Elizabeth II made a personal distribution in most years since 1953, and the ceremony is no longer held at Westminster every year. Thus, the 1979 service attended by the Queen and Prince Philip was held in Winchester Cathedral. The money is specially struck in silver pennies, twopennies, threepences and fourpences and is unaffected by decimalisation. Each recipient receives one complete set of coins for every ten years of the sovereign's age, with the odd years made up by coins to the appropriate value. Thus, in 1990, when Elizabeth II was in her sixty-fourth year, sixty-four men and sixty-four women each received six complete sets and one fourpenny coin. The coins bear the young head of the sovereign, as when first struck, throughout his or her reign.
