Power Play

We're in a world of rising power-players, from the appalling to the beguiling. From nations flexing their political and military "muscle", to popular figures with cult-like followings.

Yet we're all power-players when we bring it down to the individual level. We all strive to be in control of our lives, circumstances, and the people to whom we relate. The extent to which we manage to do that gives us a sense of security and hope.

Exerting power and being in control is in fact the normal way that the world and we operate. This was fully on display when Jesus was arrested. Chief priests, soldiers and Jesus' betrayer came with force of numbers and weapons to overpower Him, and in His disciple, Peter, striking back with the sword.

But then Jesus displayed the "upside-down world" of his kingdom. He did not fight back with force or weapons against His oppressors, and He insisted Peter lay aside his sword, and reversed the injury he had inflicted.

This foreshadowed that Jesus would defeat evil oppression, not by destroying all evil doers, rather by suffering their oppression, to pay for, cancel and forgive it, and save them into a wholly new way of life based upon His love and grace.

To do this frees us from a "fight or flight" response to uncontrollable events, and from exerting control over others by getting our own way, putting others down and criticising them. It enables us to trust in the saving grace of Jesus and hold out grace to all.
