KYB will meet again from **Monday 2nd Feb at 10:00 am.**



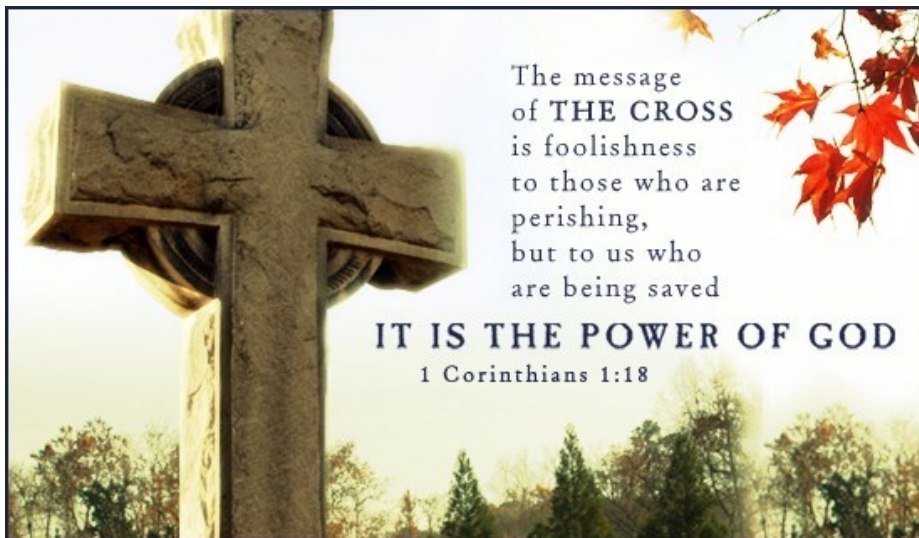
Our Women's Breakfast now has a new name—"The Open Table".

What's In Your Basket

"Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, spoke up, "Here is a boy with five small barley loaves and two small fish, but how far will they go among so many?".....Jesus then took the loaves." John 6: 8-9, 11
